During the summer holidays 12 scouts joined nearly 6000 people other Scouts and Leaders from over 44 countries worldwide an international camp in Windsor (WINGS) All Scouts had an excellent fun filled time over a whole week.

Towards the end of October the Scouts attended a District Scout Camp where they took part in all different team games and challenges, based around three

zones, puzzle, challenge and physical. They also took part in shooting, archery climbing which were held at night under flood lights.

In to the new year the Scout section are covering 4 badges Fire Safety, Model Making, Emergency Aid and Forestry, as part of this badge work they will visit to Moulton Fire Station in January as well as having NEAT (Northampton Emergency Aid Team) coming in and doing first aid. We shall also

be doing air rifle shooting, archery, climbing wall and using the woods at Overstone as much as possible.

In January there will be a Patrol Leaders Training weekend and it is hoped most of the Scouts Parents will join in the Family camp in June and hopefully the Scouts will be holding a weekend camp around August. We shall be attending the County Camp as well as a District camp during 2010.
